Information on logos

Logos can enhance the appearance of your honoree's legacy story and help recognize organizations important to your honoree. Moreover, many logos are in the public domain. Some are protected by copyright registration, however, so you will need permission from the owner of that logo if you want to add it to your honoree's legacy story. If the logo has a registration mark or trademark, that mark should appear with the logo when used.

Most public domain logos can be easily found on the Internet on sites such as "Google Images." When you search for a logo or an action shot, you will frequently find different versions to choose from, as shown in the baseball example.



When you find a logo you want to include in your honoree's legacy story, right click on the logo and a new window will open. Click on "Save image as..." and copy the logo to your desktop or an appropriate folder to use for your story. You can crop the image as desired.





The logo of many organizations are very recognizable, including those for military branches and units, religious orders, political parties, service organizations and medical associations. See examples of some of these logos.
