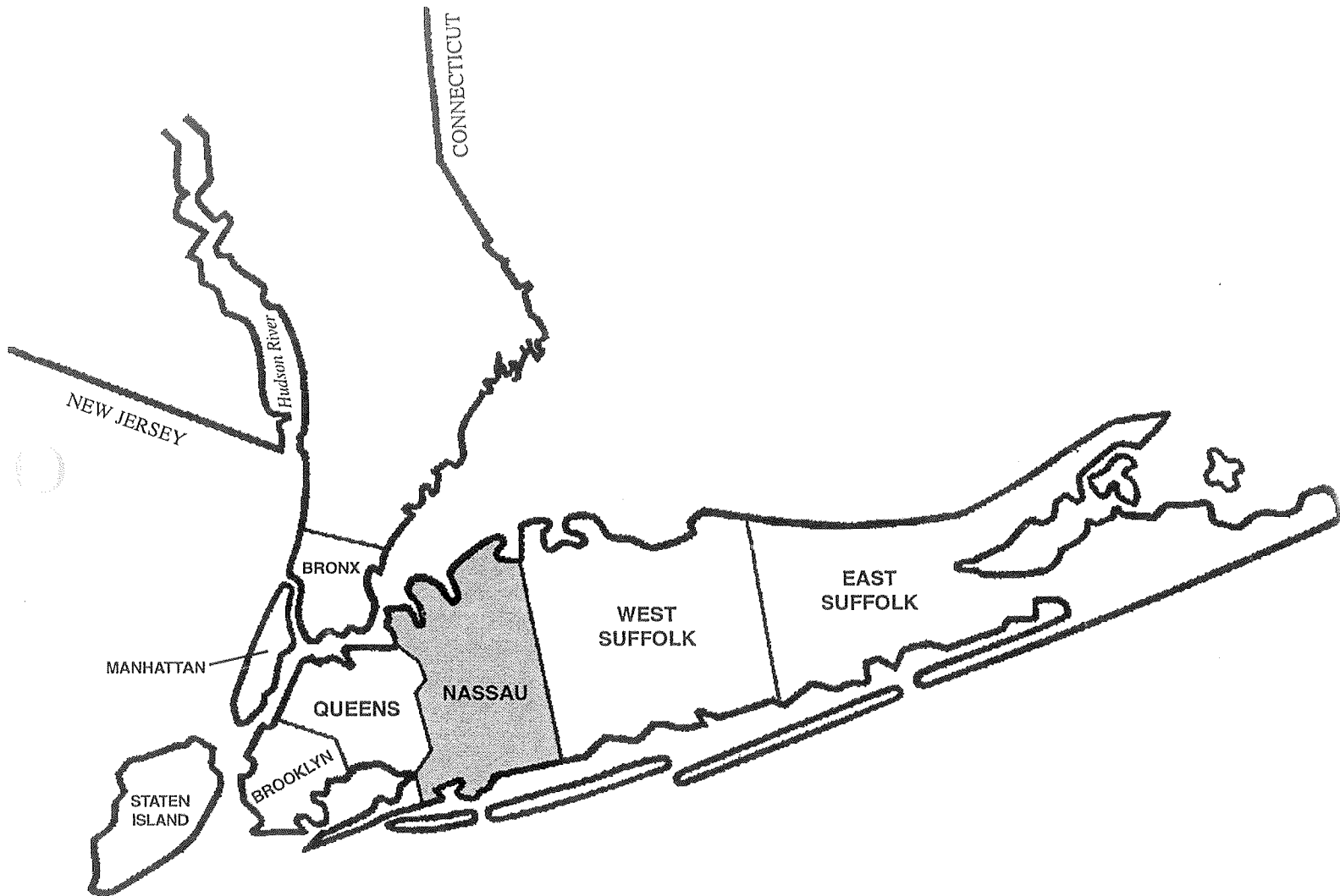

About Nassau BOCES

The Board of Cooperative Educational Services of Nassau County (Nassau BOCES) serves the 56 school districts of Nassau County, Long Island, by providing cost-effective shared services and programs. These include career training for adults and high school students, special education, alternative schools, technology education and teacher training, as well as numerous initiatives to expand educational opportunity and help districts operate more efficiently. The agency, which was created in 1967, is the youngest—and the largest—of the 38 BOCES in New York State. Legislation passed in 1948 authorized all of the BOCES.

Most children in the state attend neighborhood schools that reflect the local community's values. Yet small school systems are at a disadvantage in serving students with special needs, purchasing equipment or introducing new technology. To solve this problem, the state legislature created boards of cooperative educational services to encourage local school districts to pool their resources. BOCES can offer services and programs that individual school districts cannot operate as efficiently or as cost-effectively, such as specialized schools for severely disabled children, regional computer services centers, and shared professional training programs for teachers.

The Nassau BOCES serves all 56 local school districts in Nassau County that have more than 300 schools and approximately 180,000 students. The board enables the county's residents to enjoy all the benefits of locally controlled schools while reaping the benefits of being part of a large cooperative.

Funding for the Nassau BOCES comes from the 56 local districts. Each district pays a proportional share of the BOCES's administrative costs, and local school boards vote on its administrative budget each spring. In addition, each district decides which Nassau BOCES services it needs and then pays a share of the cost of those services. As an incentive to cooperate and share resources, New York State gives local school districts funds to partially reimburse them for BOCES services and administrative costs.

The Nassau BOCES is organized into two divisions. One division houses all programs and services for school districts and the human resources department. The other division houses internal operations, such as the business office and facilities operations.

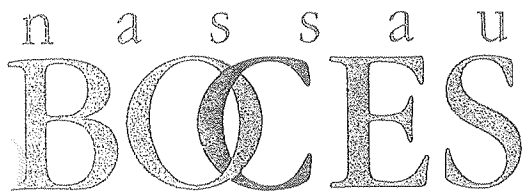
The Nassau BOCES is guided by a nine-member board, elected by members of the boards of education in the 56 component districts. It has nearly three dozen locations; sites range from large facilities, such as the Nassau Tech Westbury Center, to a cluster of classrooms in a local school. The BOCES offers approximately 100 different programs and services that change constantly to respond to the needs of school districts. Its staff includes educational planners, naturalists, public relations professionals, printers, bus drivers, computer network technicians, pioneers in the art of data mining, experts in risk management and web designers, in addition to hundreds of classroom teachers and teacher aides. The Nassau BOCES has a total of nearly 3,000 full- and part-time employees.

About the Workshop:

The Foundation is looking to build national, state-specific, and cultural databases that provide accurate social and political histories of the nation, replete with thematic lessons, units and instructional materials, to help educators meet the requirements of new standards-based instructional guidelines. Social studies professionals in each state and the District of Columbia will create these inclusive, content-rich databases and instructional units and lesson plans. All of the curriculum materials aim to acknowledge and honor the diversity of our population and to broaden the perspective from which history and social studies are taught K-12. Mr. Kullen was the editorial coordinator and production supervisor of a 700-page *Graphic Arts Guide*, and has taught in the adult education program at the Catholic University of America. What is Americans All® New York?

American All® New York is a program of The People of America Foundation. Their mission is to help this nation, especially its students, understand the social and economic value created by its diversity. It will accomplish this by continuing to develop national, state-specific and cultural databases that provide an accurate social and political history of the nation, as well as generic, thematic lesson units and individual lesson plans that help educators meet the requirements of new standards-based instructional guidelines.

What do we get as a registered school?

At a minimum, each registered school is guaranteed the following:

- **One Teacher Resource Package.** This package contains one complete set of the American All® resource materials, the music program, the poster collection, the photograph collection and a CD-ROM of all program components.

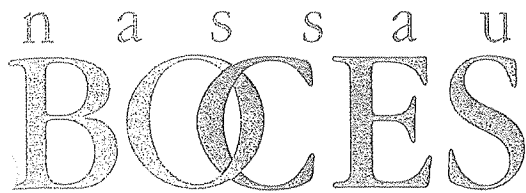

I. Mission, Goals and Philosophy of the People of America Foundation

Mission. Our nation is not homogeneous, so its political history cannot serve as its shared cultural history. The Foundation aims to collect, organize, distribute and maintain, at no cost to the public, the largest and most inclusive electronic database on the history of the peopling of the United States.

Goals. The Foundation will develop national, state-specific and cultural databases that provide accurate social and political histories, as well as generic, thematic lesson units and individual lesson plans, to help educators meet the requirements of new standards-based instructional guidelines. Social studies professionals in each state and the District of Columbia will create these inclusive, content-rich databases and instructional units and lesson plans.

Philosophy. Underlying the Foundation's mission is the concept that, for any field or area of specialization, all information physically exists but is not universally accessible to all its members. And, even if the data were accessible, unless it is organized and delivered in a form that can be easily understood and used, the information has limited value.

II. Structure

Americans All® is a national education program that provides teachers, students and parents with comparative information, previously unavailable, about six ethnic and/or cultural groups that helped build our nation—Native Americans, African Americans, Asian Americans, European Americans, Mexican Americans and Puerto Rican Americans. More than 2,000 schools and libraries use this information, and the Foundation still sells the materials to education organizations and the public.

The People of America Foundation, established in October 1995, is a 501(c)(9), publicly supported, nonprofit organization. It succeeds the Coordinating Committee for Ellis Island, founded in 1983 as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, that developed and marketed the Americans All® Resource Materials. KPMG Peat Marwick files annual tax returns for the People of America Foundation.

III. Support for the People of America Foundation

The Foundation's mission is recognized and supported by all 50 states and the District of Columbia. In addition, it has established strategic partnerships with the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO), the National Association for Elementary School Principals (NAESP), the National Middle School Association (NMSA), the Council of State Social Studies Specialists (CS4) and the National Association of State Directors of Career Technical Education Consortium (NASDCTEc). The boards of other major education organizations are reviewing the Foundation's request for recognition and support.

The Foundation has also been endorsed by the National Council for the Social Studies (NCSS) and its mission and goals have gained the recognition and/or support of the National Social Studies Supervisors Association (NSSSA), the National Education Association (NEA), the American Federation of Teachers (AFT), the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the National Association of State Boards of Education (NASBE), the American Federation of School Administrators, AFL-CIO (AFSA), Social Science Education Consortium, Inc., the American Association of School Administrators (AASA), the International Union of Police Associations, AFL-CIO (I.U.P.A.), National History Day (NHD), Empower America and the National Retired Teachers Association. Many of these organizations have chosen not endorse or fully participate in this initiative as strategic partners because their bylaws or a decision of their board of directors precludes such participation.

IV. Pilot Registration and State Support

Besides the work being done in New York, the Foundation is operating grassroots pilot programs in three other states. In North Dakota the Foundation has received support from public and private schools representing more than 83 percent of registered students. All major education organizations within the state also support the program. North Dakota State University will manage Americans All® North Dakota.

In Nevada the Foundation has received support from public and large nonpublic schools representing more than 65 percent of registered students. Many major education organizations within the state support and/or recognize Americans All®. The program will most likely be managed by a partnership between the Nevada Cultural Arts Foundation and the Nevada Public Education Foundation.

In Vermont the Foundation has received support from public and approved independent schools representing more than 65 percent of registered students. All major education organizations within the state also support the program. The Vermont Historical Society will be the fiscal agent for Americans All® Vermont. Curriculum development will be the responsibility of the Vermont Department of Education. The program will be managed by a partnership between these two organizations.

In New York, because of its size, the Foundation is piloting the program in a single district, the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of Nassau County (Nassau BOCES), on Long Island. The effort has just recently begun, but the Foundation has already received support from public schools representing more than 55 percent of registered students. This portion of Americans All® New York will be managed by the Nassau BOCES, which will establish an operational plan that can be replicated elsewhere in the state.

V. Desired Partnership for State Implementation

The People of America Foundation will not begin the next stage of the program unless full funding for each state is assured prior to start-up. Start-up is activated when more than 50 percent of the schools (or students) in a state have enrolled with the Foundation. Funds for each state will be kept in an escrow account and released on a benchmark-based schedule, prepared in advance by the state, to meet its implementation obligations. The state will always have a draw against the next benchmark to ensure it has operating funds at all times.

The Foundation's national staff will include full-time employees to help each state obtain additional or matching funds as may be appropriate and available. Although the Foundation will provide New York with program planning guidelines, the implementation structure and methodology will be at the state's discretion. In addition to the public school districts, where possible, the state will include all recognized independent schools. The state program will take four years to complete.

VI. School Responsibilities

For schools, this program is an opportunity, not an obligation. To participate in the Foundation's program, for which there is no cost, a school must verify its enrollment because the quantity and composition of materials each school will receive as a gift from the Foundation depends on its student enrollment. Each school must also provide the Foundation with the names of at least two teachers who will serve as liaisons to ensure the program materials will be put to maximum use. Teacher names will not be published nor made available to commercial list brokers, but will only be given upon written request to state social studies supervisors to assist in their staff development efforts.

In addition to making schools eligible to receive Americans All® Resource Materials, school registration affords principals funds for staff development. Facilitated by the Nassau BOCES, this staff development will be geared toward teaching school personnel how to use the materials most effectively. Enrollment also qualifies the school to receive a biweekly newspaper and future publications prepared under grants to the Foundation and to have access to instructional and teacher learning sites not available to the general public. Further, registration enables teachers and principals to gain national recognition for posting effective, school-developed lesson plans on the Foundation's Web sites.

VII. Outcomes of the State and National Programs

The People of America Foundation will ultimately host 153 coordinated Web sites, three for each state and three for the District of Columbia—for elementary school, middle school and high school. These will be organized in several ways, including, for example, by subject, by topic and in relation to standards. When all state activity is complete, the Foundation will consolidate all of the state Web sites into three major national sites—for elementary school-, middle school- and high school-level instruction. It will also consolidate the state information into national ethnic and/or cultural databases.

Each state must provide, in print form, a state-specific timeline, poster and photograph collection; the development and production costs for these materials are already figured into the grant. Other deliverables will be at the sole discretion of the state and will meet local objectives. The state will hold all copyrights on materials it produces, subject to prior and existing copyrights. Each state will also grant the Foundation permission to upload all information that has been gathered by the state onto the national Web sites, regardless of whether this information is delivered to the state's schools in print format.

The composite national Web sites will be "closed"; individuals can link to the sites from any location on the Web but cannot link out to another site without shutting down their browser. Therefore, the site, which will also be password-protected on each computer terminal, prevent users—mostly students—from making unsupervised visits to, or transfers from, other sites, for example, those containing games or pornography. The schools can easily monitor site activity.

VIII. Vision and Goals of Americans All® New York

Vision: To develop content-rich and user-friendly Web sites and supporting materials that contain primary sources, lesson plans, assessments, and other resources that accurately depict New York's diverse cultural history and to provide professional development to New York educators on the use of these Web sites and supporting materials.

Goals:

- To identify materials and resources that accurately depict New York's diverse cultural history.
- To provide New York educators with the content-rich, standards-based materials, resources and professional development they need to teach New York history.
- To facilitate the collaboration of various historical groups throughout New York.
- To promote the use of primary sources as a teaching tool.

IX. Schedule and Operating Plan for New York

The Nassau BOCES will serve as fiscal agent for the program. A management team composed of representatives from the Nassau BOCES, the state's BOCES system and the five large cities will serve as the operating agent for the state. All schools within the state will receive Foundation resources, but only staff of the BOCESs and the five large cities that have met the Foundation's registration requirements will participate in program planning. Before moving forward with implementation, the state must receive word from the Foundation that funds have been secured.

As soon as funding is secured, the Nassau BOCES will:

- establish a steering committee composed of individuals and organizations endorsing the program and representatives of the Nassau BOCES, other BOCES and the five large cities within the state;
- hire a full-time program director and necessary staff;
- finish developing an organizational structure for the program that will facilitate the identification of resources and enable user-friendly access (e.g., Framework themes and National Standards themes);
- collaborate with local historical societies, schools and other organizations to provide access to primary documents that show the cultural diversity of New York;
- contact directors of other program sites and coordinate efforts on program implementation;
- work, with Foundation assistance, to establish the framework for the three New York Web sites and upload the instructional frameworks and all standards requirements;
- begin linking all existing materials to the Web sites;
- begin working on ethnic histories and missing data needed to fill out the Web sites, using resources within the state;
- develop a state-specific timeline, poster and photograph collection to document the people and cultures that have shaped New York;
- establish criteria and identify instructional units, lesson plans, and other resources related to New York history;
- provide resources, materials and professional development on how to use primary sources as a teaching tool;
- promote collaboration among all BOCES, large cities, local historical societies, schools, universities, libraries and other organizations in the teaching of New York's history;
- establish a process for continued management and upkeep of the Web site; and
- work with the People of America Foundation to seek additional resources to continue program, Web site and professional staff development.

X. Operational Plan for Americans All® “Individual BOCES”

- An individual from the BOCES distributes information on the program to all public and private schools within the state.
- If the initial response is strong, the program director convenes a meeting with as many representatives of major education organizations within the BOCES as possible.
- The district superintendent sends a letter to all principals and district social studies supervisors or coordinators asking schools to register for the program.
- After one month, the program director sends all schools correspondence that provides additional information on the program and reinforces the benefits of school participation. The program director begins making follow-up calls to all schools to determine whether they have concerns that are keeping them from registering for the program. The program director will make these calls only to districts where the local social studies supervisor or superintendent has given his or her permission to do so.
- Once schools representing more than 50 percent of total enrollment have registered via the Web, the program director sends a final letter to all schools in the district. The letter thanks the schools that have registered and explains the results of the registration phase to all the other schools.

XI. Americans All® New York Management

The Nassau BOCES serves the 56 school districts of Nassau County, Long Island, by providing cost-effective shared services and programs. These include career training for adults and high school students, special education, alternative schools, technology education and teacher training, as well as numerous initiatives to expand educational opportunity and help districts operate more efficiently. The agency, which was created in 1967, is the youngest—and the largest—of the 38 BOCES in New York State. Legislation passed in 1948 authorized all of the BOCES.

Most children in the state attend neighborhood schools that reflect the local community's values. Yet small school systems are at a disadvantage in serving students with special needs, purchasing equipment or introducing new technology. To solve this problem, the state legislature created boards of cooperative educational services to encourage local school districts to pool their resources. BOCES can offer services and programs that individual school districts cannot operate as efficiently or as cost-effectively, such as specialized schools for severely disabled children, regional computer services centers, and shared professional training programs for teachers.

The Nassau BOCES serves all 56 local school districts in Nassau County that have more than 300 schools and approximately 180,000 students. The board enables the county's residents to enjoy all the benefits of locally controlled schools while reaping the benefits of being part of a large cooperative.

Funding for the Nassau BOCES comes from the 56 local districts. Each district pays a proportional share of the BOCES's administrative costs, and local school boards vote on its administrative budget each spring. In addition, each district decides which Nassau BOCES services it needs and then pays a share of the cost of those services. As an incentive to cooperate and share resources, New York State gives local school districts funds to partially reimburse them for BOCES services and administrative costs.

The Nassau BOCES is organized into two divisions. One division houses all programs and services for school districts and the human resources department. The other division houses internal operations, such as the business office and facilities operations.

The Nassau BOCES is guided by a nine-member board, elected by members of the boards of education in the 56 component districts. It has nearly three dozen locations; sites range from large facilities, such as the Nassau Tech Westbury Center, to a cluster of classrooms in a local school. The BOCES offers approximately 100 different programs and services that change constantly to respond to the needs of school –districts. Its staff includes educational planners, naturalists, public relations professionals, printers, bus drivers, computer network technicians, pioneers in the art of data mining, experts in risk management and web designers, in addition to hundreds of classroom teachers and teacher aides. The Nassau BOCES has a total of nearly 3,000 full- and part-time employees.

Steering Committee

(In Formation)

Marie Archibee is a supervisor with the Department of Curriculum, Instruction and Technology of the Nassau Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES), Office of Curriculum, Instruction and Professional Development, in Nassau County, New York. She coordinates workshop activities, organizes science curriculum writing teams, supervises office staff and maintains communication with districts.

Previously she was project coordinator for Nassau BOCES Vocational and Applied Technical Education Act. In that position, she coordinated a curriculum project with public school educators to produce a teachers' resource guide, orchestrated its distribution to 56 school districts in Nassau County, conducted companion workshops and coordinated a team of occupational education teachers. Formerly she worked with Metro BOCES, coordinating a staff development project, supervising English language arts (ELA) teachers and developing, producing and distributing an ELA project guide.

A respected speaker and workshop leader, Dr. Archibee gave a presentation on character education to the Nassau Association of District Curriculum Officials (NADCO) and organized a three-day staff development conference. In addition, she developed a curriculum video for student administrators, was the main speaker at a regional occupational education meeting and spoke at the Uniondale Public School Symposium. She also served on NADCO's committee to establish roundtable discussions about pre-service and student teaching procedures, was the Nassau BOCES state liaison for middle-level education for Nassau County and was an educational consultant for the Jaguar and British Car Museum in Mahwah, New Jersey.

Dr. Archibee has B.S. and M.S. degrees in human development education from State University College at Buffalo. She holds a professional diploma in educational administration from Long Island University-C.W. Post College, New York and earned her Ph.D. in educational administration at New York University.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

John Gangemi began working at the Nassau Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) as a special education teacher and worked in that capacity from 1968 until mid-1974. In 1974 he became an administrator in what was then the Division of General Services and, after three reorganizations, he became the executive director of the Department of Curriculum, Instruction and Technology. He is now deputy superintendent of Nassau BOCES.

The Department of Curriculum, Instruction and Technology is concerned primarily with professional development for teachers and administrators, helping school districts incorporate instructional technology into the classroom and develop curriculum and assessments to enable students to meet the new standards. It is also responsible for the Nassau School Library System, Educational Communications, the Bilingual Educational and Technical Assistance Center, and an \$8.6-million Title III Technology Literacy Challenge Fund Grant, which now includes 117 districts on Long Island.

Dr. Gangemi also is the Nassau BOCES liaison to the state education department for most matters having to do with curriculum instruction and staff development. He has been instrumental in developing for Nassau County and other New York school districts the Assessment Liaison Program, which trains teachers in all aspects of authentic assessment, and the Comprehensive District Educational Plan which about 200 districts in the state now use.

Dr. Gangemi holds a bachelor's degree in sociology from Adelphi University and a master's degree in special education from Hofstra University. He earned his Ph.D. in educational administration from New York University.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Maryann Llewellyn is a Supervisor with the Department of Curriculum, Instruction and Technology, Nassau Board of Cooperative Educational Services in Nassau County, New York. She is responsible for professional development, data analysis, K – 12 academic support programs, and leadership and special programs for high-needs districts, the Literacy Center, Bilingual and ESL support.

Her previous positions in New York were Principal at Landing School, Glen Cove, adjunct professor in the administrator program of the College of New Rochelle, Superintendent and Principal in the East Quogue School District and Director of Curriculum and Instruction with Garden City Public Schools. Ms. Llewellyn also taught classes in the Riverhead School District, at Dowling College, at the Mestrect Teacher Center, and at the Pulaski Street School.

A respected speaker and presenter, she has given talks, presented seminars and led workshops for various organizations. These include the National Association for Staff and Curriculum Development, Montauk schools, the C.W. Post Principals Academy and numerous school district superintendent conference days.

Ms. Llewellyn holds a bachelor's degree in social studies from Long Island University in South Hampton. She earned her master's degree in educational administration from Long Island University C.W. Post.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Maria R. Petraglia, an associate professor of graduate education for Molloy College in New York City, was instrumental in developing and implementing a new graduate program there that leads to a master of science degree in education. She teaches various graduate courses, many of which she designed, and is an independent consultant to school districts and education agencies on organizational and instructional development.

Previously she served as Superintendent of Schools for Manhasset Public Schools, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction for Lawrence Public Schools and District Coordinator of Instruction and Staff Development for Bay Shore Public Schools, all in New York State. She also was a classroom teacher for several years in school districts in Massachusetts and New York.

A recognized speaker, Dr. Petraglia has presented in-service courses and speeches at numerous educational events, including the 2001 annual conference of the Northeastern Educational Research Association, the South Shore Administrators Association, the Nassau Association of District Curriculum Officials and the School Administrators' Association of New York State. She has been a member of the American Association of colleges for Teacher Education, the American Educational Research Association, and the national, state and local Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development.

Dr. Petraglia received her bachelor's degree in psychology from State University College at Oneonta, New York, and her Master's in elementary education from Suffolk University in Boston University, Bank Street College, Columbia University, Long Island University and Hofstra University. She received her Ph.d. in educational administration from New York University.

Gene Silverman, with an education career that spans 20 years, is the Assistant Director of the Department of Curriculum, Instruction and Technology at the Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES), in Nassau County, New York. She is responsible for the Department's supervision, grants and programs, strategic planning and new development. Prior to this position, she served as the department's Supervisor and Assistant Coordinator for the Department of Career Education.
