

Dear School Principal:

The Department of Education is sending this letter as a follow-up to our previous correspondence regarding the People of America Foundation. We would like to offer you the opportunity to participate in what is believed to be a very worthwhile project. When funded, this project will provide increased educational opportunities for Vermont schoolchildren, targeted support for staff development and new materials tied directly to our state's social studies curricular framework.

As educators, we are amazed by the continuously increasing amount of information available to our teachers and students via the Internet. Yet this enthusiasm needs to be tempered by concerns about the quality, reliability, inclusiveness and, sometimes, even the appropriateness of the material. The People of America Foundation was established to address these concerns. It aims to collect, organize, distribute and maintain, at no cost to the public, the largest and most inclusive electronic database of the peopling of the United States; the database will be keyed to individual state social studies standards.

The Foundation has designed this program so that all costs of developing and maintaining the database will be borne by corporate sponsors (please see the attached information sheet). The national Web site through which the database will be accessed will carry appropriate sponsorship recognition but will not contain commercial advertising. Neither will the print publications developed through this initiative include advertisements. The sponsors' value, in addition to demonstrating their support for today's youth, will be derived from the enormous good will they will generate by making this information available to the public. As an important first step in its plan, the Foundation has acquired the rights to the Americans All® National Education Program.

We are very excited about this new project. The Foundation is not new; through Americans All®, it has been a developer of diversity-based teaching materials for more than 18 years. Because the Foundation understands that demographics vary, it will rely on each state's education system to develop and use the commercial-free data in a manner that best serves the needs of its students. The Foundation will also provide each school with a printed summary of the most important state-specific elements included in the electronic database, creating a much-needed bridge between print and digital media.

We will represent the Foundation in Vermont. Our multiyear development plan for these new resources will also include an opportunity for teachers from participating schools to publish their most effective lesson plans. This will assist them in their professional growth and increase the volume of quality, grassroots material for the national Web site.

Thank you for registering for Americans All® Vermont. As you know, your state has been selected to serve as a national pilot site for a historical investigation and curriculum development project with the People of America Foundation. The project's goals are to offer free, high-quality, locally approved, and diversity-based social studies materials as a supplement to existing social studies curriculum materials. Nevada and North Dakota are also participating in the pilot. Including three states with different demographics and geographic locations increases the reliability of the test data.

Through this project, the Foundation will create a national Web site that will house state databases created by social studies experts within each state. These databases will make local and state history information available to students across the United States. In addition, all information in these databases will link directly to each state's social studies scope and sequence and to its assessment and testing requirements. Schools will also have free, direct access to curriculum and teaching materials used elsewhere in the nation. Further, by providing a greater choice of screened and approved curriculum and teaching materials, including text, audio and visual materials, the project also will provide more tools to those who teach children with special needs.

We have been contacting principals because you are the key decision-makers within schools. We have asked you to signal your support of the project to potential funders by registering your school at www.americansall.com. The response within Vermont has been excellent. We are nearly ready to begin this initiative and want to update you on our efforts.

What does registration mean for your school? What are we asking of your teachers?

Project registration is an opportunity, not an obligation. It costs nothing for your school to participate in the Foundation's initiative. Registration ensures that your school will receive multiple copies of the print materials that complement the state's database and other free, state-approved curriculum and teaching materials. In addition, participating schools will receive a biweekly newsletter, access to special Web-based teaching sites, invitations to attend Foundation regional and national meetings, and opportunities for school personnel to participate in staff development programs. Further, teachers from registered schools will be able to electronically share their favorite lesson plans. As part of the registration process, we asked you to name at least two teachers who will help ensure funders that the Foundation materials will be put to maximum use. Their names will not be published nor made available to commercial list brokers.

Who else in Vermont besides schools has expressed support and/or interest?

We have received letters from the Vermont Department of Education, Vermont Historical Society, Vermont Folklife Center, Vermont Alliance for the Social Studies, University of Vermont, Shelburne Museum, and South Burlington School District. D. Joseph Davison,

who has reviewed our materials relative to the Vermont Standards and Learning Opportunities Framework, has also expressed his support for the project. Copies of those letters are enclosed.

What are the current registrations in Vermont, Nevada and North Dakota?

To date, schools representing nearly 57 percent of Vermont's students, 63 percent of Nevada's students and 78 percent of North Dakota's students are registered for the project. In addition, we recently received a request from Nassau County, Long Island, a large school district in New York, to participate in the pilot. We have already registered schools representing more than 20 percent of its student population following an initial mailing. Registration data by Vermont school district is enclosed.

What does the Foundation need now to proceed?

We have met our thresholds for school registration and have received support from education organizations in all three states. Now we await the designation of a management entity that will receive project funds in Vermont. North Dakota has already satisfied this requirement. Jill Peck and the education department are working hard to create this entity in Vermont. A similar effort is ongoing in Nevada.

When will the project begin?

Once all three pilot states have designated their management entities, the Foundation can officially solicit corporate sponsorship. We have been communicating with that sector for months, laying the groundwork for our official launch. We plan to announce this project to the nation within the next six weeks. As soon as funding is received, we will contact all registered schools to verify their enrollment, mailing address and project teacher names. We will then distribute materials to registered schools based on their enrollment and start posting data on newly created Web sites for Vermont, Nevada and North Dakota. We are very excited to begin this initiative.

As you know, Vermont is one of three states selected to serve as a national pilot site for a historical investigation and curriculum development project with the People of America Foundation. The response from schools within the state has been excellent. We are ready to proceed and want to ensure that schools still interested in participating have the information they need to do so. This memo answers questions that principals have posed in connection with this project.

What is the project about in a nutshell?

A national Web site will house state databases created through the project. These databases will make local and state history information available to students across the United States. In addition, all information in these databases will link directly to each state's social studies scope and sequence and to its assessment and testing requirements. Schools will also have free, direct access to curriculum and teaching materials used elsewhere in the nation. Increased diversity within the student population requires more comprehensive and inclusive social studies resources. Moreover, an electronic database reinforces students' and teachers' desire to supplement textbook information with Web-based research.

Why are you contacting me, the school principal?

Principals are the key decision-maker within schools. To obtain funding, we need to demonstrate support for the project to potential sponsors. These sponsors are most interested in grassroots support by local schools. This is why we have encouraged principals to signal that support by registering their schools at www.americansall.com. Registering for the project demonstrates that you agree with the project's goals to offer free, high-quality, locally approved, and diversity-based social studies materials as a supplement to existing social studies curriculum materials.

What does registration mean for my school? What are you asking of my teachers?

Project registration is an opportunity, not an obligation, and it costs nothing for your school to participate in the Foundation's initiative. Registration ensures that your school will receive multiple copies of the print materials that complement the state's database and other free, state-approved curriculum and teaching materials. We have received written support from the Vermont Department of Education, Vermont Historical Society, Vermont Folklife Center, Vermont Alliance for the Social Studies, University of Vermont, Shelburne Museum, and South Burlington School District. D. Joseph Davison, who has reviewed our materials relative to the Vermont Standards and Learning Opportunities Framework, has also expressed his support for the project. Copies of those letters are enclosed.

What is the current registration in Vermont?

To date, schools representing nearly 57 percent of Vermont's students are registered for the project. Registration data by school district is enclosed.

What other states are participating in the pilot and what is their progress?

Nevada and North Dakota are the other two pilot sites. To date, schools representing 63 percent of Nevada's students and schools representing 77 percent of North Dakota's students are registered with the Foundation. In addition, we recently received a request from Nassau County, Long Island, a large school district in New York, to participate in the pilot. We have already registered schools representing more than 20 percent of its student population following an initial mailing.

When will the project begin?

Now that we have achieved a registration of more than 50 percent in each of the pilot states and have the internal support we need, we plan to announce this project to the nation within the next six weeks. As soon as funding is received, we will distribute materials to participating schools and begin placing data on the newly created Web site for Vermont.

However, most of our original historical documents and artifacts are in various locations around the state, not easily accessible to Vermont educators and students. This project will provide a database to share these valuable primary resources in a way that is equitable and easily accessible.



I'm writing this letter to let you know I've been doing a little work with the Americans All Program and its relationship to the Vermont Standards and Learning Opportunities Framework.


As you may or may not know, during the 1997-98 school year, I was awarded a Christa McAuliffe Fellowship. During my year, I was given the task by the Vermont Department of Education to re-visit and revise seven of the Fields of Knowledge Standards in Social Studies in the Vermont Framework. With the help of a committee that I selected, we were able to accomplish this. In addition, I was asked to work with teachers in Vermont in creating and evaluating standards-based teaching units. I became a jurist whose responsibility it was to assess units created by Vermont teachers that were submitted for inclusion in a state-wide resource on the Inter-Net. Teachers from all over the country could then access these units to be used in their classrooms. Obviously, being familiar with the Vermont Framework was crucial.

When you asked me to look over the Americans-All materials, of course I was curious as to how well the program was aligned with the Vermont Framework. I looked primarily at the high school materials since I taught on the high school level for 35 years. In one activity entitled New Home, I found a great deal of correlation in the activity goals, and the objectives, as well as the knowledge material being in line with the Field of Knowledge Standards in the Vermont Framework. There was also substantial correlation in the Learning Opportunities of the Framework as well.

I am very confident, that this program would dove-tail nicely into the Vermont Framework. I also feel that by aligning this program, it would go a long ways in the implementation of the program throughout the state of Vermont. Teachers here are looking for materials that are "standards friendly", that would enable teachers to tap into these resources without having to take the time to research and align the activities themselves.

I hope that my humble research has been helpful. If there are any questions, please let me know.

Implementation Plan for Americans All® Vermont

Background

The People of America Foundation, established in October 1995, is a 501(c)(9), publicly supported, nonprofit organization. It succeeds the Coordinating Committee for Ellis Island, founded in 1983 as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, that developed and marketed the Americans All® Resource Materials.

Americans All® is a national education program that provides teachers, students and parents with comparative information, previously unavailable, about six ethnic and/or cultural groups that helped build our nation—Native Americans, African Americans, Asian Americans, European Americans, Mexican Americans and Puerto Rican Americans. More than 2,000 schools and libraries use this information, and the Foundation still sells the materials to education organizations and the public.

KPMG Peat Marwick files annual tax returns for the People of America Foundation.

Mission, Goals and Philosophy of the People of America Foundation

Mission. Our nation is not homogeneous, so its political history cannot serve as its shared cultural history. The Foundation aims to collect, organize, distribute and maintain, at no cost to the public, the largest and most inclusive electronic database on the history of the peopling of the United States.

Goals. The Foundation will develop national, state-specific and cultural databases that provide accurate social and political histories, as well as generic, thematic lesson units and individual lesson plans, to help educators meet the requirements of new standards-based instructional guidelines. Social studies professionals in each state and the District of Columbia will create these inclusive, content-rich databases and instructional units and lesson plans.

Philosophy. Underlying the Foundation's mission is the concept that, for any field or area of specialization, all information physically exists but is not universally accessible to all its members. And, even if the data were accessible, unless it is organized and delivered in a form that can be easily understood and used, the information has limited value.

Support for the People of America Foundation

The Foundation's mission is recognized and supported by all 50 states and the District of Columbia. In addition, it has established strategic partnerships with the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO), the National Association for Elementary School Principals (NAESP), the National Middle School Association (NMSA), the Council of State Social Studies Specialists (CS4) and the National Association of State Directors of Career Technical Education Consortium (NASDCTEc). The boards of other major education organizations are reviewing the Foundation's request for recognition and support.

The Foundation has also been endorsed by the National Council for the Social Studies (NCSS) and its mission and goals have gained the recognition and/or support of the National Social Studies Supervisors Association (NSSSA), the National Education Association (NEA), the American Federation of Teachers (AFT), the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the National Association of State Boards of Education (NASBE), the American Federation of School Administrators, AFL-CIO (AFSA), Social Science Education Consortium, Inc., the American Association of School Administrators (AASA), the International Union of Police Associations, AFL-CIO (I.U.P.A.), National History Day (NHD), Empower America and the National Retired Teachers Association. Many of these organizations have chosen not endorse or fully participate in this initiative as strategic partners because their bylaws or a decision of their board of directors precludes such participation.

Pilot Registration and State Support

Besides the work being done in Vermont, the Foundation is operating grassroots pilot programs in three other states. In North Dakota the Foundation has received support from public and private schools representing more than 83 percent of registered students. All major education organizations within the state support the program. North Dakota State University will manage Americans All® North Dakota.

In Nevada the Foundation has received support from public and large nonpublic schools representing more than 65 percent of registered students. Many major education organizations within the state support and/or recognize Americans All®. The program will most likely be managed by a partnership between the Nevada Cultural Arts Foundation and the Nevada Public Education Foundation.

In New York, because of its size, the Foundation is piloting the program in a single district, the Nassau Board of Cooperative Education Services (BOCES), on Long Island. The effort has just recently begun, but the Foundation has already received support from public schools representing more than 55 percent of registered students. This portion of Americans All® New York will be managed by the Nassau BOCES, which will establish an operational plan that can be replicated elsewhere in the state.

Current Status of Americans All@ Vermont

In Vermont the People of America Foundation has received support from public and approved independent schools representing more than 65 percent of registered students. Americans All@ Vermont has received support and/or recognition from the Vermont Department of Education (Ray McNulty, Commissioner); the Vermont Historical Society (Ann Cunningham, Director of Education); The Vermont Folklife Center (Jane C. Beck, Executive Director, and Gregory Sharrow, Director of Education); the Vermont Alliance for the Social Studies (Elise A. Guyette, President); The University of Vermont (Paul Eschholz, Director, Center for Research on Vermont and Vermont Studies Program, and Kristin Peterson-Ishaq, Coordinator, Center for Research on Vermont and Vermont Studies Program); the Shelburne Museum (Catherine Woods Brooks, Director of Education, and Karen E. Peterson, Associate Director of Education); the Champlain Valley Education Consortium (Darlene H. Worth, Director of Curriculum, South Burlington School District); and D. Joseph Davison (former Christa McAuliffe fellow). All letters of support and/or recognition are on file with the Vermont Department of Education.

Desired Partnership for Vermont Implementation

The program will be managed by a partnership between the Vermont Department of Education (VTDOE)—www.state.vt.us/educ—and the Vermont Historical Society (VHS)—www.state.vt.us/vhs. VTDOE derives its powers and duties from those of the State Board of Education and the Commissioner of Education. The department operates under the *State Board of Education's Manual of Rules and Practices*. The rules aim to ensure all students in Vermont public schools are afforded educational opportunities that are substantially equal in quality. They also seek to enable them to achieve or exceed the expectations set forth in *Vermont's Framework of Standards and Learning Opportunities*.

The rules promote continuous improvement in student performance and the provision of high-quality programs to enable students to attain rigorous standards. They “establish a transitional system for measuring improvement in student performance in order to identify schools that may encounter difficulty in providing a high quality of education” . . . “and a system for providing technical assistance to such schools” (Rules 2000 and 2100).

The Vermont Historical Society, founded in 1838 by an act of the state legislature, is an independent membership organization governed by a board of trustees. VHS's mission is “to collect, preserve and interpret Vermont history for the use, education and enjoyment of present and future generations.” VHS is the only institution in the state that collects artifacts and documents reflecting the entire history of the state. To accomplish this, the Society operates a museum that creates exhibits; borrows and lends objects for display; sponsors public programs throughout the state; provides services, training and resources for students, educators and local historical societies; operates a research library; publishes periodicals and books that promote research and disseminate information about Vermont history; and collaborates with other educational and cultural organizations to make Vermont's past accessible to the public.

The overarching goal of VHS is to assume a statewide leadership role in promoting an understanding of Vermont history. It does so by improving and expanding public access to its collections and by expanding its interpretive and educational efforts.

To meet its goal of increased public accessibility, the Society has identified five major priorities:

- to facilitate the teaching of Vermont history by producing the educational materials and outreach programs necessary for all schools in the state;
- to support the work of local historical societies by providing technical assistance and forums that encourage collaboration among these societies;
- to develop the Internet as an educational outreach tool;
- to make the resources of VHS more accessible to wider audiences by producing exhibitions, publications and programming that interpret the collections and utilize new research; and
- to promote Vermont history through heritage tourism initiatives.

VHS is expanding and relocating some of its operations. On the first floor of the Pavilion Building in Montpelier, where the Society's library, offices and museum are currently located, VHS will create:

- an introductory exhibition on Vermont history, *Freedom & Unity: One Ideal/Many Stories*;
- classroom and orientation space for educational outreach programming for schoolchildren and for visitors to the state's capital and the State House; and
- an expanded museum store.

VHS's other operations are moving into the Vermont History Center, formerly the Spaulding Graded School in Barre, Vermont. This newly renovated 60,000-square-foot building will house the research library, collections storage, study space for the collections, changing exhibit space, a hands-on history gallery, administrative offices and an education and conference center.

The Vermont History Center will provide the space and access to collections needed to initiate new educational programs, such as teachers' workshops, hands-on "discover history" courses, summer "history camps" for students, and educational programs designed for use with changing exhibits. Americans All@ Vermont is one of the new opportunities that will enable VHS to promote an understanding of Vermont history.

VHS, because of its experience in fiscal matters and in operating programs of this type, will serve as the fiscal agent for Americans All@ Vermont. Once the program is established, an advisory council will be created with representatives from all supporting organizations within the state. The management of the program will be decided at the time of funding. Either two co-directors or a single director with two assistant directors will supervise the program. One individual will coordinate VHS's data-collection efforts and one will be the curriculum liaison with VTDOE and be responsible for curriculum and standards issues.

Management personnel will supervise the development of the state's Web sites to ensure content is included that specifically relates to *Vermont's Framework of Standards and Learning Opportunities* and ensure the sites contain all of the data collected by program staff. The goal is to meet the information needs of the state's K–12 school students as well as the information needs of other residents and visitors to the state or to the state's Web sites for the program. The curriculum co-director will be responsible for preparing the deliverables to the schools—the state-specific timeline, poster and photograph collection.

Once funded, the People of America Foundation will grant VHS \$1,184,499. The Foundation's national staff will include full-time employees to help each state obtain additional or matching funds as may be appropriate and available. Although the Foundation will provide Vermont with program planning guidelines, the implementation structure and methodology will be at the state's discretion. In addition to the public school districts and the approved independent schools and kindergartens, where possible, the state will include all recognized independent schools and technical schools. The state program will take four years to complete.

The People of America Foundation will not begin the next stage of the program unless full funding for each state is assured prior to start-up. Start-up is activated when more than 50 percent of the schools (or students) in a state have enrolled with the Foundation. Funds for each state will be kept in an escrow account and released on a benchmark-based schedule, prepared in advance by the state, to meet its implementation obligations. The state will always have a draw against the next benchmark to ensure it has operating funds at all times.

School Responsibilities

For schools, this program is an opportunity, not an obligation. To participate in the Foundation's program, for which there is no cost, a school must verify its enrollment because the quantity and composition of materials each school will receive as a gift from the Foundation depends on its student enrollment. Each school must also provide the Foundation with the names of at least two teachers who will serve as liaisons to ensure the program materials will be put to maximum use. Teacher names will not be published nor made available to commercial list brokers, but will only be given upon written request to state social studies supervisors to assist in their staff development efforts.

In addition to making schools eligible to receive Americans All® Resource Materials, school registration affords principals funds for staff development. This will enable school personnel to learn how to use the materials most effectively. Enrollment also qualifies the school to receive a biweekly newspaper and future publications prepared under grants to the Foundation and to have access to instructional and teacher learning sites not available to the general public. Further, registration enables teachers and principals to gain national recognition for posting effective, school-developed lesson plans on the Foundation's Web sites.

Outcomes of the State and National Programs

The People of America Foundation will ultimately host 153 coordinated Web sites, three for each state and three for the District of Columbia—for elementary school, middle school and high school. These will be organized in several ways, including, for example, by subject, by topic and in relation to standards. When all state activity is complete, the Foundation will consolidate all of the state Web sites into three major national sites—for elementary school-, middle school- and high school-level instruction. It will also consolidate the state information into national ethnic and/or cultural databases.

Each state must provide, in print form, a state-specific timeline, poster and photograph collection; the development and production costs for these materials are already figured into the grant. Other deliverables will be at the sole discretion of the state and will meet local objectives. The state will hold all copyrights on materials it produces, subject to prior and existing copyrights. Each state will also grant the Foundation permission to upload all information that has been gathered by the state onto the national Web sites, regardless of whether this information is delivered to the state's schools in print format.

The composite national Web sites will be "closed"; individuals can link to the sites from any location on the Web but cannot link out to another site without shutting down their browser. Therefore, the site, which will also be password-protected on each computer terminal, prevent users—mostly students—from making unsupervised visits to, or transfers from, other sites, for example, those containing games or pornography. The schools can easily monitor site activity.

Vision and Goals of Americans All® Vermont

Vision: To develop content-rich and user-friendly Web sites and supporting materials that contain primary sources, lesson plans, assessments, and other resources that accurately depict Vermont's diverse cultural history and to provide professional development to Vermont Educators on the use of these Web sites and supporting materials.

Goals:

- To identify materials and resources that accurately depict Vermont's diverse cultural history.
- To provide Vermont Educators with the content-rich, standards-based materials, resources and professional development they need to teach Vermont history.
- To facilitate the collaboration of various historical groups throughout Vermont.
- To promote the use of primary sources as a teaching tool.

Schedule and Potential Operating Plan for Vermont

Under terms of the agreement between VHS and VTDOE, VHS will serve as the Foundation's fiscal agent in Vermont. VHS and VTDOE will jointly supervise the program as the management entity. Before moving forward with implementation, however, the state must receive word from the Foundation that funds have been secured.

As soon as funding is secured, VHS and VTDOE will:

- establish a steering committee composed of individuals and organizations endorsing the program, members of VHS and VTDOE, and additional educators and administrators, as needed;
- hire a full-time program director (or two co-directors) and necessary staff;
- finish developing an organizational structure for the program that will facilitate the identification of resources and allow for user-friendly access (e.g., Framework themes and National Standards themes);
- collaborate with local historical societies, schools and other organizations to provide access to primary documents that show the diversity of Vermont. (e.g., The Vermont Folklife Center and The University of Vermont, Center for Research on Vermont and Vermont Studies Program);
- contact directors of other program sites and coordinate efforts on program implementation;
- work, with Foundation assistance, to establish the framework for the three Vermont Web sites and upload the instructional frameworks and all standards requirements;
- begin linking all existing materials to the Web sites;
- begin working on ethnic histories and missing data needed to fill out the Web sites, using resources within the state;
- develop a state-specific timeline, poster and photograph collection to document the people and cultures that have shaped Vermont;
- establish criteria and identify instructional units, lesson plans, and other resources related to Vermont history;
- provide resources, materials and professional development on how to use primary sources as a teaching tool;
- promote collaboration among VHS, VTDOE, local historical societies, schools, universities, libraries and other organizations in the teaching of Vermont's history;
- establish a process for continued management and upkeep of the Web site; and
- work with the People of America Foundation to seek additional resources to continue program, Web site and professional staff development.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Jane Beck has served as the executive and founding director of The Vermont Folklife Center since 1984. The center is a cultural heritage organization dedicated to preserving and presenting the folk arts and traditions of Vermont and the surrounding region. Through her work for The Folklife Center, Dr. Beck has been involved in curating more than 20 exhibitions as well as producing numerous publications and several radio series, including a Peabody Award winner. Most recently she has completed a major project, funded by the Lila Wallace–Reader’s Digest Fund, which included two exhibitions and two companion radio series based on traditional storytelling in New England. Her previous position was as Vermont folklorist for the Vermont Council on the Arts in Montpelier, Vermont.

She has spoken or presented papers for the American Folklife Center in Washington, D.C.; the American Folklore Society; the Bennington Museum in Bennington, Vermont; the International Symposium on Creatures of the Legendary, held at the University of Nebraska, Omaha; the State University of New York at Potsdam; local Vermont historical societies; and other organizations. Dr. Beck is the author of *To Windward of the Land* (Indiana University Press, 1979); *The Vermont Country Store: An Oral History* (Vermont Council on the Arts, 1980); and *Memories Touched By Fancy: Bessie Drennan, Vermont Artist* (Vermont Folklife Center, 1990). She has written articles for periodicals such as *Folklore*, *Ethnohistory*, the *Journal of the Folklore Institute*, the *Journal of American Folklore* and *Antiques Dealer* and has written essays for several books. She has also developed still photography, videotapes and visual media presentations on topics in history and folklore.

Dr. Beck received her B.A. in American literature from Middlebury College in Middlebury, Vermont, and holds M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in folklore from the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Douglas Chiappetta has worked for the Vermont Department of Education for 15 years, and he currently serves as the director of the department's Educator and School Quality Team. In this position, he oversees curriculum and instruction, home and independent schools, school construction, licensing and professional standards, educational technology and leadership development.

Before becoming a department director, he was manager of the School and Instructional Support Team, for whom he managed six workgroups responsible for improving school quality. Previously Mr. Chiappetta was also the manager of the School Development and Information Team and chief of the School Improvement Team. Earlier, as school improvement coordinator, he administered the public school approval program by providing direct technical assistance for approximately 60 public schools in the southwest part of the state.

Before coming to the Vermont Department of Education, Mr. Chiappetta was involved for several years in secondary school education. At Harwood Union High School in Moretown, Vermont, he was department chair and served on the Educational Resources Team. Prior to that, he was director of curriculum at Steward School in Richmond, Virginia. Earlier, he had taught English at Harwood.

Mr. Chiappetta holds a bachelor of science degree in secondary education from the University of Connecticut in Storrs. He received his master of education degree in educational planning and administration from the University of Vermont in Burlington.

Steering Committee

(In Formation)

Amy Cunningham is the director of education at the Vermont Historical Society. Founded in 1838, the society collects and exhibits artifacts and documents that reflect the history of the state; sponsors public programs throughout Vermont; provides services, training and resources; operates a research library; and publishes periodicals and books about Vermont history. It also collaborates with other organizations to make Vermont's past accessible to the public.

Before coming to the Vermont Historical Society, she worked on exhibits and educational programs at museums and historical sites in Maine, New York, and North Carolina. Her workplaces included the Pejepscot Historical Society, the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum, and the Cape Fear Museum.

Ms. Cunningham is completing work for her master's degree in museum studies at the Cooperstown Graduate Program in Cooperstown, New York. She also holds a bachelor's degree in history, with social studies teaching certification, from the University of North Carolina at Asheville.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Joe Davison is an educator whose career has spanned more than 30 years, most of that time at Bellows Free Academy in St. Albans, Vermont. He taught on the middle school and high school levels, including a two-year stint at Battle Mountain Junior/Senior High School in Colorado. He spent one year as a Christa McAuliffe Fellow, focusing on *Vermont's Framework of Standards and Learning Opportunities* and developing standards-based units and assessment tools for statewide testing.

While he was a Wilton Park Fellow in England, Mr. Davison attended a session on international issues related to weapons development and proliferation. He was one of two U.S. teachers selected to participate in this experiment of including educators in this important dialogue. He has also conducted teacher workshops for developing standards-based units and coordinating standards with district-wide curriculum. He was the chairman of the social studies department at Bellows Free Academy for 12 years before he retired in 2001.

He was active in the Vermont Education Association, the National Education Association, the National Association of Social Studies Teachers and the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development. He also coached football, boys and girls basketball, and cross-country running for most of his career, and he was advisor for the Model United Nations Program at Bellows Free Academy.

Mr. Davison holds a bachelor's degree, with a dual major in physical education and history and social studies, from the University of Colorado. He continued his education with courses from the University of Vermont and workshops in curriculum development and teaching methodology. He was involved in a Peace Corps training program in urban community development in Brazil; trained as a paralegal, he was assigned a special project in Rio Branco in the northwestern part of the country.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Paul A. Eschholz has been with the University of Vermont since 1969. Currently he is professor of English and serves as director of both the Center for Research on Vermont and the Vermont Studies Program. He also served briefly as associate dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. He directed "How to Teach Writing in a Humanities Context: A Program for High School and College Teachers in Vermont" and "The Vermont Writing Program: Writing in Grades 1-9," both supported by the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Dr. Eschholz received the University of Vermont Alumni Council's George V. Kidder Award for excellent teaching and outstanding contributions to undergraduate education, and he was named a Distinguished Friend of Education by the Vermont Headmasters Association. He cowrote, with Arthur W. Biddle, *Literature of Vermont: A Sampler*, and he and coauthor Alfred Rosa wrote three books: *Language: Readings in Language and Culture*, *The Writer's Brief Handbook* and *Language Awareness*. Dr. Eschholz also has written articles for *Vermont Life* and was editor of the book *Vermont: A Study of Independence* by Rowland Robinson.

In addition to his B.A. from Wesleyan University, he earned an M.A. in English from the University of Vermont and a Ph.D. in American studies from the University of Minnesota.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Alice Evans has been an assessment consultant with the Vermont Department of Education since 1998. She has represented Vermont in the Comprehensive Social Studies Assessment Project (CSSAP), a 25-state consortium directed by the Council of Chief State School Officers. Through CSSAP she was a major contributor to the design of a social studies portfolio assessment system, for which she developed materials, trained teachers and benchmarked student portfolio entries.

She has served on committees to revise Vermont's history and social sciences standards, and history and social sciences endorsement competencies (teacher licensing requirements). She provides staff support to the Policy Advisory Committee for Vermont's statewide assessment and school accountability systems and facilitates the development of comprehensive local assessment programs. Previously, she served as supervisor of testing in the Norwalk (Connecticut) Public Schools, and as an education consultant with the Connecticut State Department of Education.

A frequent presenter at state, regional and national conferences of assessment and educational measurement organizations, Dr. Evans also is active in national and international research organizations that promote more effective schools. She was invited to participate in a 1994 symposium in Oxford, England on "Testing Children and Youth", sponsored by the International Commission on Testing. She has been honored twice by Division H of AERA for her reports on school district assessment programs.

With 27 years of experience in public education, she is a consultant to school districts, providing technical assistance in program evaluation, research design, analysis and interpretation of assessment results, and communication of research findings.

Dr. Evans holds a B.A. degree from Ottawa University in Kansas [Spanish and Philosophy majors], and an M.A.T. from Spalding College in Kentucky. She earned her Ph.D. from the University of Connecticut.

Kerry Raymond Garber is Title V grant coordinator and assistant director of the Educator and School Quality Team with the Vermont Department of Education (VT-DOE) in Montpelier. Prior to his current positions, he was school improvement coordinator and Eisenhower Higher Education and Goals 2000 grant reader, also both for VT-DOE. Previous positions include project leader for Equity and Excellence: Action Planning Guide with VT-DOE, principal of Fayston Elementary School in Fayston, Vermont, and principal of Mathewson School in Barre, Vermont. He has taught in East Montpelier, Vermont, and Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Formerly an associate faculty member in special education with the University of Vermont's College of Education and Social Services, Mr. Garber also was an instructor in graduate programs in special education at St. Michael's College in Winooski. He has been a member and active participant in the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, the National Association of Elementary Principals and the New England League of Middle Schools.

Mr. Garber holds a bachelor of arts degree in English language and literature from Boston University. He earned his master of education degree in special education from the University of Vermont in Burlington.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Elise A. Guyette is a consultant on history, social sciences and curriculum development for schools, theaters, television and museums. She has produced K–12 professional development videotapes with the Regional Educational Television Network and worked with Vermont schools to implement and assess *Vermont's Framework of Standards and Learning Opportunities*. She codirected “Historical Artifacts, Primary Sources and the World Wide Web,” a project that links classrooms and local historical societies.

She was chair of the Vermont Department of Education's History and Social Science Commission. In that capacity, she coordinated the statewide committee that developed the history and social science standards for *Vermont's Framework of Standards and Learning Opportunities* and cochaired the statewide group that developed the teacher's guide for the *Framework*. She was a member of the project steering committee and produced two statewide conferences for teachers on how to use the standards in the classroom.

In 1992, as a museum educator for a local history museum in Durban, South Africa, Ms. Guyette researched and wrote a teacher's guide for two exhibits on Mahatma Gandhi—the first of their kind in postapartheid South Africa. She also led teacher workshops there.

Ms. Guyette is the author of *Vermont: A Cultural Patchwork* (Cobblestone Publishing, 1986) and *Vermont: A Cultural Patchwork Teacher's Guide* (Cobblestone Publishing, 1986). She has many published curricula, including teacher's guides to museum exhibits and video and theater productions, and has published nine articles, including one on the history of racial and ethnic minorities in New England. She has taught seven college and university courses, five at the graduate level.

She has conducted workshops and presentations on the topics “The History of Immigration to Vermont,” “The Lives of African Americans in Early Vermont, 1790–1870” and “Building Standards-Based Curriculum and Assessment.” Among other locales, she was a guest lecturer at Yunnan Normal University in Kunming, China, in April 2000. In 1982 the National Education Association honored Ms. Guyette with the Dorros Peace Trophy, given for the year's most significant contribution to global awareness.

Ms. Guyette holds a B.S. in secondary social sciences, an M.A. in history and an M.Ed. in curriculum development, all from the University of Vermont. She is currently a doctoral student in social science education at the University of Vermont, Montpelier.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Carla Kotas Lewis has been teaching for over 25 years, primarily at the Fayston Elementary School in Fayston, Vermont. She has taught grades two through six in both multi-age and single grade classrooms and has helped to establish and promote many new initiatives in her school. She has been an active participant in numerous committees, working on curriculum and assessment, as well as serving on both the Local Standards Board and the Professional Development Committee.

She has been actively involved in using and promoting *Vermont's Framework of Standards and Learning Opportunities*, including serving on a statewide committee to revise the reading and literature standards. In addition to developing her own standards-based units of instruction, she has provided professional development for individual teachers and school districts. This has been accomplished through conferences, workshops, and two courses, taught as an adjunct faculty member at Trinity College and St. Michael's.

Twice, she was named in Who's Who of America's Teachers, was Teacher of the Year for the Washington West District, and a finalist for Vermont's Teacher of the Year. This year she received a Christa McAuliffe Fellowship Award, which allowed her to leave the classroom to provide further professional development around standards and areas of literacy. She also became the Project Coordinator for an online mentoring program, called "Vermont Poetry Online" for grades one through 12.

Ms. Lewis received her Bachelor's Degree from the University of Nebraska with a dual major in elementary and special education. She earned her Masters Degree from the University of Vermont in Reading and Language and has continued course work in a variety of curricular areas.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Jill L. Peck is the framework specialist and consultant for standards-based curriculum, instruction and assessment for the Vermont Department of Education. She is responsible for maintaining and revising *Vermont's Framework of Standards and Learning Opportunities* and for professional development and resources associated with implementing Vermont standards. Ms. Peck has taught kindergarten through grade 12 for 16 years.

In 1997 she was awarded the Christa McAuliffe Fellowship and worked with more than 1,000 Vermont teachers and administrators. She returned to her classroom in 1998 and was offered a unique professional development opportunity called Making Connections: A Standards-Based Classroom in Action. Six Vermont educators spent two days each month in her classroom learning how to implement Vermont standards.

Ms. Peck is the author of two standards-based units of instruction and has taught several graduate-level courses on standards-based education for Norwich University. She also has served as a guest speaker for the University of Vermont, St. Michael's College, Lyndon State College and Johnson State College. In addition, Ms. Peck has traveled to Singapore to consult with the Singapore Ministry of Education and to help develop national standards there.

Currently, she is on the board of directors for the Vermont Association for Middle Level Educators and is a member of the steering committee for Vermont's Education for Sustainability Project. She also represents Vermont on the Comprehensive Social Studies Assessment Project, a 25-state consortium directed by the Council of Chief State School Officers. Ms. Peck is active in the Community History Project, a partnership between Vermont's local historical societies and Vermont schools. Through this project she provides professional development and curriculum support to educators and local historical society staff. She is also responsible for managing and developing Vermont's Standards Into Action, an Internet-based software tool set developed in conjunction with IBM to support Vermont's education reform efforts.

Ms. Peck holds a B.S. in elementary education and speech therapy and is certified in regular and special education. She is enrolled in a graduate program at Southern New Hampshire University—Vermont Center.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Karen E. Petersen is associate director of education at Shelburne Museum in Shelburne, Vermont, and an adjunct faculty member at St. Michael's College in Colchester. She conducts museum staff training on material culture, 19th- and 20th-century social history and museum interpretation trends. She formerly served as the museum's supervisor of school programs. Before assuming her positions at the museum, she was a teaching intern and then coordinator of the Genesis Program, both at Mt. Abraham Union High School in Bristol, Vermont. She served as the capital campaign coordinator and director of development for the Flynn Theatre for the Performing Arts in Burlington. She also was museum educator and museum director at Rokeby Museum in Ferrisburgh.

Other career activities of Ms. Petersen include an experiential living workshop to explore 18th-century Vermont life and teacher training workshops for the Flynn Theatre for the Performing Arts and Shelburne Museum Collaboration on the Gold Rush and The Vermont Folklife Center and Shelburne Museum Collaboration on Storytelling. She was a project team member on *Ticonderoga: An Interdisciplinary Curriculum Package* from Shelburne Museum, and she received a special citation from the New England Museum Association for publications design. She was on the governing board of the Vermont Museum and Gallery Alliance, and she is a member of the New England Museum Association.

In addition to her B.A. in political science from Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut, Ms. Petersen holds an M.Ed. in curriculum and instruction, with secondary education certification, from the University of Vermont. She also has done work at the master's level in American history, with an emphasis on 19th-century social history, at the University of Vermont.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Kristin Peterson-Ishaq is coordinator and managing editor for the Center for Research on Vermont in the University of Vermont's College of Arts and Sciences, Burlington, Vermont. As coordinator, she finds funds to support research projects; communicates current research to scholars and the public; and provides support services, such as review and referral, for scholars conducting research. As managing editor, she serves on the center's board of editors and is the primary liaison with authors and reviewers. Most recently she was managing editor for *Vermont State Government Since 1965*, a 668-page book published by the center for the University of Vermont. She is editor of the quarterly newsletter and is responsible for the center's annual report and all publicity materials.

Compiler and editor on two books for the University of Vermont, Ms. Peterson-Ishaq also translated Yusuf Idris's novel *al-Haram (The Sinners)* from Arabic to English, and she has been editor or coeditor on conference proceedings and other publications. She has been a member of the Lake Champlain Committee, the Middle East Institute, the Middle East Studies Association of North America, the Vermont Historical Society, and the Vermont Labor History Society. She also served on the board of trustees for the Vermont Labor History Society.

Ms. Peterson-Ishaq has a B.S. in Arabic language, *magna cum laude*, from Georgetown University in Washington, D.C., and an M.A. in Arabic language and literature from The American University in Cairo, Egypt.

Steering Committee (In Formation)

Gregory L. Sharrow is director of education and folk arts coordinator at The Vermont Folklife Center in Middlebury, Vermont, a position he has held since 1988. He worked previously as a fieldworker and program participant in the Smithsonian Institution's Festival of American Folklife in Washington, D.C.

He taught at Braintree Elementary School in Braintree, Vermont, where he was a member of a teaching team responsible for instruction in language arts and social studies for grades four through six. He developed materials for units focusing on family history, community history and regional folklife. He also taught at Randolph Junior High School in Randolph, Vermont, as a special education tutor. He developed and implemented supplementary programs for learning disabled students in grades seven through nine.

Dr. Sharrow was curator for "From Before My Grandmother: The Vermont Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Program" and "Thinking Like a Blacksmith: Artistry and Tradition in the Late Twentieth Century," exhibits at The Vermont Folklife Center Gallery in Middlebury and the Billings Farm and Museum in Woodstock, Vermont.

He coproduced, with Michael Sacca, four videos for The Vermont Folklife Center: *The Abenaki of Vermont: A Living Culture*, *Zeke's Wheel*, *Dancing with Our Ancestors* and *Educated Hands: Newt Washburn—A Life with Baskets*. He was executive producer for Vermont Public Radio's 15-part audio series *Never Done: Farm Life in Vermont*, which won the Corporation for Public Broadcasting's Gold Award.

Dr. Sharrow has written several publications, including *Many Cultures, One People: A Multicultural Handbook about Vermont for Teachers* (The Vermont Folklife Center, 1992) and *Families on the Land: Profiles of Vermont Farm Families* (The Vermont Folklife Center, 1995). He has also written teacher's guides for "Measured Furrows: Vermont's Farming History" (The Vermont Folklife Center and Vermont Educational Television, 1996); "On My Own" and "Journey's End" (The Vermont Folklife Center, 1996); and "The Abenaki of Vermont: A Living Culture" (The Vermont Folklife Center, 2002). He has been a co-author of several more publications, including, with Jane Beck, *Recording Words: Collecting Oral History and the Art of Interviewing* (The Vermont Folklife Center, 1994). He has written four essays that will be published in *The Encyclopedia of New England Culture* (Yale University Press, in press). He is also the author of articles appearing in *Northeast Folklore* and *Visit'n: Conversations with Vermonters*, vols. 3, 5, 6, 7 and 8 (The Vermont Folklife Center, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2002).

In addition to a bachelor's degree in East Asian studies from Oberlin College, Dr. Sharrow holds an M.Ed. in teacher education from the University of Vermont and a Ph.D. in folklore and folklife from the University of Pennsylvania.

Steering Committee (In Formation)






