If anyone has produced a more comprehensive, enticing or rewarding multicultural curriculum than Americans All, we haven't seen it. This study program developed by the Coordinating Committee for Ellis Island, N.Y., examines U.S. history through the experiences and achievements of six major cultural groups (African Americans, Asian Americans, European Americans, Mexican Americans, Native Americans and Puerto Ricans). The material is designed to supplement existing social studies curricula for grades 3, 5, 8 and 11 but could easily stand on its own. Replete with resource handbooks, time lines, charts, maps, audiocassettes, hundreds of archival photographs and an in-service video, Americans All is a veritable museum in a box. Prices (around \$400 per grade level to \$1095 for the school-wide starter) are reasonable, considering the yearround usefulness of the program.
